THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK: Mistaken Identity

All over the world you will find places with names that look and sound as if they had their origins in Scotland. This is quite a feat for a small country at the top of an island in the north Atlantic! It is a testimony to the hardiness and adventurous nature of the Scottish people, who fearlessly ventured out across the world taking their culture and place names with them.

My parents, being good hardy and adventurous Scots, ventured out as newlyweds in 1925 to settle in Alberta in western Canada. And like so many other Scots, they named their farm Dumbreck after my father's family farm in Aberdeenshire as a way of remembering home.

However, not all places abroad with a Scottish sounding name are named after a real place in Scotland, or are actually Scottish names at all! There is an impressive 9,630-foot-high pyramid shaped mountain in Alberta, Canada, which is called Mount Glasgow. Everyone assumes it is named after the City of Glasgow. The truth is that it is named after the battleship HMS Glasgow, built in Glasgow in 1909, which helped to sink a German cruiser and another ship in the Battle of the Falklands in 1914.

How easy it is to fall into the trap of mistaken identity. I am not a great lover of the City of Glasgow, but I would prefer a beautiful mountain to be named in honour of Glasgow, rather than after a battleship which was involved in war and the loss of life of brave soldiers and sailors.

Names are the way we identify people, and parents struggle long over choosing an appropriate name for a child. I have not come across the name, Judas, as a boy's name! I well remember my daughter's parents-in-law being scandalised at the name of a Solicitor's office in Cupar – Pagan Osbourne! Would you trust a solicitor with the surname Pagan?

I am sure Bill Pagan was a very nice man and a good solicitor, it is just unfortunate that we attribute unappealing characteristics to certain names, a simple case of mistaken identity.

All of us in church today are proud to take the name Christian, and the world has a well-established understanding of what to expect of a person with that name. Does your life live up to the expectations of that name, or is it a case of mistaken identity?
